HYPER-GRACE MOVEMENT

Justification and Sanctification Conflated--Both Monergistic

General Indicatives

The inherent sinfulness of believers and their inability to walk in obedience to God's law

God's unconditional grace and one-way love; his desire to show mankind how much He loves them through Jesus' death on the cross

Christ's righteousness imputed to believers for justification and sanctification; past, present, and future sins are forgiven; God is eternally pleased with Christians because He only sees Christ when He views them

Personal Imperatives

Recognize that you cannot please God through your own efforts--for your justification AND your sanctification

Affirm that Christ's sacrifice and obedience on your releases you from a continuing obligation to strive for holiness and to obey God's moral law

Celebrate God's all-encompassing grace, favor, and positive regard for you--no matter how you behave

Disregard biblical exhortations to lead a disciplined life and be holy; categorize them as legalism/law and regard them as opposed to the truth of God's gratuitous grace
